Reports

Principal / Vice Principal

- Grade assessments occurred: Based on the results the government is providing funding for grade 4's to receive assistance a couple days a week. This will start soon on Wednesdays and Fridays to work on literacy and numeracy
- Pre K - If you know of anyone that might be thinking about attending please encourage them to contact sturgeon public for screening. There is still room for approximately 12 students.
- Mr. Stephen put out an inquiry regarding thoughts/feelings/perspective on the Pre K mid day bussing - is it beneficial or not? Is it worthwhile?
 - A parent inquired if he would like us to survey it on FB - Dan did not feel that this would be beneficial. He was strictly wondering what the word of mouth is regarding the bussing for Pre K
- April 24 is Sturgeon Night of Music and the Fine Arts display. If your child's art work is picked you will receive tickets.
- Religion Program - Numbers have been decreasing significantly over the

past several years. Mr. Stephen is inquiring what the interest level is in continuing the Religion program long term. Do parents feel the need/want for this course will increase?

- Members inquired if there is maybe a volunteer that can assist in running this program?
- If the program continues to decline, is there an option to still provide the opportunity to celebrate mass on special occasions etc.
- Mr. Stephen appreciated the comments and feedback and will consider all information.
